tomorrow. Members and friends of the church have been invited to attend the series of dedicatory and fellowship services at the new location.

New church building will be dedicated

The congregation of Faith Lutheran Church will dedicate an attractive new church and Sunday School building tomorrow at 4785 Jackson.

Dedicatory services will be conducted at 10:30 a.m. with Rev. Richard M. Brandt, the pastor, officiating and Rev. Victor L. Behnken, president of the Southern California District, as guest speaker.

Preceding the services of dedication those involved in the construction of the new building will participate in a door-opening ceremony along with Rev. Brandt and Rev. Behnken.

THE OTHER participants are O. J. Bruer, the architect; Theodore Schiermeyer, the contractor; and Theodore Thompson, the chairman of the church building committee.

Elders Paul Fountain, Bernard Lane and Charles Vought will bring the sacred vessels into the new church to be consecrated by the pastor.

At 4 p.m. a thanksgiving service will be conducted by Rev. Brandt. Rev. George T. Fisher, a member of the Southern California District Mission Board, will be the speaker.

A **LIGHT** lunch will be served by the women of the church at 5 p.m. and the members and friends will have an opportunity to inspect the new facilities.

The chapel and parish hall include more than 6,000 feet of floor space. The open laminated beam construction inside harmonizes with the ash paneling behind the altar.

A 10-foot cross is suspended before the altar and a brass candelabra, donated by

Dr. and Mrs. Carl Eckhardt, flanks the altar.

LIGHT COMES into the building through 16 stained glass windows which have

windows behind it will be illuminated at night.

The stained glass windows were donated by Mr. and Mrs. Carl Bostick.

FAITH LUTHERAN Church was organized Nov. 4, 1937 and held services in Jenkin hall in the Arlington area until 1948 when the congregation bought the chapel at Cypress and Chapel.

Rev. August C. Stahnke led the congregation until 1958 when he accepted a call to northern California. Rev. Brandt was installed as pastor in July 1959.

The building program developed under his leadership and ground was broken for the new church on Nov. 4, 1962, the 25th anniversary of Faith Lutheran Church.

SERVICES in the new building during the summer months will be at 9 a.m. followed by Sunday School and Bible Classes for teenagers and adults at 10:15 a.m.
